

#### FROM THE PASTOR



Several geriatric competitors were interviewed about how they are able to run at their advanced age, and what advice they might have for aspiring runners. Walter Lancaster, 82, from Charleston, S.C said: "A lot of people, you know, get lazy or something. And I say: 'Look. You got to keep moving.' That's the secret. Just keep moving." Yvonne Aasen, 90, from Westminster, Md said that "I can't run very much now, but when I can't run anymore, I'll still walk." Roy Englert, 99, from Springfield, Va gave his secret to success: "My consistent advice is to keep moving, keep moving, keep moving. And have a little luck."

The advice of these seniors is good wisdom for life and for faith. First, we must notice what these amazing old athletes *did not say*. Not one interviewed for the article said that you have to win the race, set a record, or earn a medal. The only requirement for success is to keep moving, to have perseverance. Indeed, we live in a world that prioritizes winning and achievement when what really matters is consistency. Just finishing the race is a victory all on its own.

In fact, the wisdom of these seniors sounds like the advice given by the author of the book of Hebrews: Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us. Faith does not require that we win the race, that we earn a gold, silver, or bronze medal. All that faith requires is that we "keep moving, keep moving, keep moving." Indeed, faith requires that we "keep praying, keep praying, keep praying." Faith requires that we "keep loving, keep loving, keep loving, keep serving, keep serving, keep serving, keep serving." As we press forward, Jesus Christ runs alongside us, and by his grace and power, he cheers us on.






