FROM THE PASTOR



I do not like mosquitoes. During our honeymoon, Abby and I camped for a couple of nights at Killarney Provincial Park in Ontario. It was the beginning of July, which is prime time for mosquitoes in that region. We were immediately swarmed! It turns out that one of Mosquito's favorite places to reproduce is stagnant water. In fact, a small puddle left on a plastic bag can become Mosquito breeding ground. Stagnant water—where nothing is coming in or going out—is the place where the unwanted and annoying insects proliferate.

Stagnation is never a good thing, especially in the spiritual life. It can lead to mucky and messy conditions, which can cultivate the growth of bugs that do not give life but suck it out. A healthy body of water means that water flows *in* from another source and water flows *out* of it. Likewise, a robust, healthy faith must be continually fed—fed with the witness of the Word, the nourishment of the sacraments, and the fellowship of the Christian community. Such feeding is the means by which God has chosen to communicate Himself to us. In other words, through Word, Sacrament, and fellowship we feed on Jesus Christ.

Even as we receive nourishment, we are also called to give and share it with each other and the world. As we have been poured into, we also pour into others. We share the gospel through our words and our deeds. We give out the love of Jesus Christ by sharing with the needy, welcoming the stranger, and caring for the vulnerable. Healthy spirituality is not just about reading the word but living the word. Healthy spirituality is not just about saying our prayers, but also putting legs on them as we live our lives.

When Jesus was once asked 'What is the greatest commandment?' he responded by saying the greatest commandment is to love God with all our heart, soul, and mind and love our neighbor as ourselves. Loving God and loving neighbor is the way we prevent spiritual stagnation. Loving God refers to what comes in: word, sacrament, Christian fellowship. Loving neighbor refers to what goes out: service, mission, acts of compassion, seeking the least, lost, and the left out. It can be less difficult to love God, or neighbor, but it gets really hard when we try to do both at the same time. Some of us are good at loving God but have a rough time serving and loving. our neighbors. Others are all about the neighbor—the horizontal dimension of faith—but struggle with loving God, the vertical dimension. Yet, Jesus is clear, a healthy spirituality includes both expressions of love.

As a church, we strive to love God and neighbor, to be fed and to feed. To that end let me share some happenings in the life of the church. Mid-Week Manna continues every Wednesday of this month. Our monthly mission focus is Evergreen ministries, and I know they appreciate all the donations they receive. The last Sunday of this month, October 31st, I am delighted to welcome Rev. Michael L. Lind-vall to the pulpit. Michael is senior pastor emeritus at Brick Presbyterian Church in New York, NY. He is a great preacher!
