"What a wondrous time is spring, when all the trees are budding. The birds begin tossing, the flowers start their blooming." So begins the song called "Pass It On" that many of us may have learned to sing at camp or a retreat and even in some churches. It does say it well. Spring is a wondrous time and spring has become alive in our yards and neighborhoods with trees putting out flowers and leaves. Birds are singing and feasting on new plant growth and the insects that are coming back to life. The perfume of honeysuckle and wisteria surrounds us if we just take the time to use our senses and breathe in the fragrance of the season.

Doris and I are trying to create a bird friendly backyard so we have bird feeders and birdbaths and are planting flowers that are supposed to attract birds and butterflies to our yard. We love to sit outside with a cup of coffee and watch the birds going here and there to enjoy what we have provided for them. Our favorites to observe are bluebirds and cardinals but we also have an abundance of robins who seem to want to be in charge and other birds scoot when they see them.

Spring reminds us that the earth is coming alive after its long winter sleep. Those long dark nights and cold days seem far away now, even though they were just a month or so behind us. Spring reminds us of resurrection, of course. What has been dead now is alive once more. Perhaps the flowers we may see have grown from a bulb that has been sitting dormant for months and now something beautiful emerges from it to bring us joy. The trees whose leaves we have raked and repurposed perhaps now have new growth on them to provide us shade in those hot months that we know will come soon enough.

Even as the earth comes alive and awakens from its winter nap, our minds are being renewed by our Lenten discipline that we began last month and we see the dawn of the resurrection in the future. Soon Holy Week will begin (with Palm Sunday on April 13) and it will be filled with activities and services to prepare our hearts for the Easter Event to follow. Holy Week Breakfast will be held on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week at 7 am each morning. The men of the church will prepare a scrumptious breakfast and it will be followed by singing and a short devotional by a local pastor. Maundy Thursday service will be held in the church at 7 pm on April 17. It is a solemn service that allows us to imagine what Jesus and the Disciples must have felt on the night in the Upper Room so long ago before Jesus went to the cross. The annual Tenebrae service will be in the sanctuary on Good Friday, April 18. The passion of the cross will be presented by our youth in song and words to leave us reflecting upon its meaning for our lives as we leave in silence.

You are invited to be a part of any or all of these special events in April that help us prepare for the joy of the resurrection on Easter Sunday at 10:30 in our sanctuary. Our Easter Service will be filled with special music and an Easter message to challenge us all to a deeper love for our savior whose victory over death brings us hope for the future.

As the song says, "That's how it is with God's love, once you've experienced it, you want to sing, it's fresh like spring, you want to pass it on." Pass on the good news to all in your world and share the love of Christ in all you do.
