

FROM THE PASTOR







A couple of months ago Gala and I audited a course at Brite Divinity School entitled "Congregational Song." Essentially, we traced the history of congregational singing from Old Testament times to the present day. I enjoyed learning about the variety of music making the church has engaged in across the millennia, and how such music has always played an indispensable role in the worship of the people of God. In my opinion, a service without music is no service of worship at all.



This course was also informative regarding hymnody in the church, and how the hymnal has evolved across the centuries. We studied earlier hymns, such as "Of The Father's Love Begotten," written in the 4th century. We surveyed great hymn writes such as Martin Luther, the Wesley brothers, and Isaac Watts. Honestly, Watts was my favorite hymn writer of them all. Isaac Watts (1674-1748) was a minister, theologian, and even a professor of logic. Yet, he is remembered in history for his hymns. Of the 750 he wrote, many of them are familiar to us: Joy to the World, I sing the mighty power of God, Jesus Shall Reign, I'll Praise My Maker While I've Breath.



Just recently a dear friend gifted me the hymnal from the Church of Scotland, and as I flipped through it, I came upon a hymn by Watts that I had not seen before. It's called "Join All the Glorious Names," and one of the stanzas of the hymn reads like this:



"Now let my soul arise, and tread the tempter down: my Captain leads me forth to conquest and a crown: a feeble saint shall win the day, though death and hell obstruct the way."



I believe this text gives a beautiful poetic expression to God's overwhelming grace and strength for hard times. "A *feeble* saint shall win the day, though death and hell obstruct the way." Sometimes, the best sermons are sung. There are, and there will be, hard moments, feeble moments, weak moments in which we wonder if we are going to make it. But thanks be to God, in Jesus Christ we have a Captain in whom and through whom we will win! Be encouraged.
